## The Power of the Gospel (Phil. 1:3-14)

- I. The Witness of the Gospel (3-6)
  - A. God is to be Thanked for the Believer's Witness (3-4)
    - 1. Paul is thankful for the Colossians (3)
      - a. He continually thanks God for them
      - b. He continually prays for them
    - 2. Paul is thankful for the Gospel's work in the Colossians (4)
      - a. He thanked God after hearing of their faith
      - b. He thanked God for the love they showed
        - i. God produces and grows faith
        - ii. God produces and grows love
          - evidences of salvation
          - loving the brethren
          - trusting in Christ
          - God is worthy of praise for all
  - B. The Gospel Produces the Believer's Witness (5-6)
    - 1. The hope of the Gospel manifested in them (5)
      - a. The hope is the imperishable salvation
      - b. The hope is understood from the gospel
        - i. They heard the word of truth
        - ii. They received hope from it
        - iii. They lived in love and faith on account of this hope
    - 2. The Fruit of the Gospel manifests in the world (6)
      - a. The gospel came to them as the rest of the world
        - i. It bears fruit in the world
        - ii. It spreads through the world
      - b. The gospel is God's power for salvation
    - 3. The work of the Gospel Begins Immediately (6b)
      - a. It grew and bore fruit in them
      - b. It grew from the first day
        - i. When they heard the gospel
        - ii. When they knew the grace of God
        - iii. When they understood the truth of Grace
- II. The Growth of the Gospel (7-11)
  - A. The Gospel Spreads by Men (7-8)
    - 1. God used Epaphras to transform the Colossians
      - a. Epaphras Brought them the gospel
        - i. God uses means
        - ii. God uses men
        - iii. God uses us
        - iv. God gives us the responsibility
      - b. Epaphras Testified to the Colossians' transformation
      - c. Epaphras was a fellow slave of Christ
      - d. Epaphras was a faithful minister of the gospel
    - 2. God will use you to transform men

- B. The Gospel Spreads Inside Men (9-11)
  - 1. God used Paul to pray for the Colossians (9a)
  - 2. Paul prayed for the continued growth in the gospel (9b-11)
  - 3. Growing in the Gospel
    - a. Growing in the knowledge of His will
      - i. It means growing in spiritual wisdom
      - ii. It means growing in spiritual understanding
    - b. Growing in a life pleasing to God (10-11) "live worth and pleasing to him"
      - i. Bearing fruit in every good deed (10)
      - ii. Growing in the knowledge of God
        - not just academic or intellect
        - personal / relational knowledge
      - iii. Being strengthened with God's power (11)
        - according to his glory and might
        - leaning more and more on Him
        - strengthened in Him, not us
      - iv. Empowered to manifest new life
        - to display patience
        - to display steadfastness
        - to display this life joyfully
      - v. Growing in our worship (11a
    - c. Growing as believers is growing in the gospel

  - A. What inspires growth in the gospel
    - 1. Promised share in our inheritance
    - 2. Deliverance from the power of darkness
    - 3. Transferred into Kingdom of the son
    - 4. Redemption and forgiveness of Sin
