Living Justified in Christ (Gal. 2:15-21)

I. Living as if Justified by Law Rejects the Gospel (15-18)

CONTEXT: Peter drawing back from Gentiles

Living opposite from his message

APPLICATION: We live opposite of our message

We put rules on others we don't keep

Not rejection of law, but understanding gospel

A. Justification by Law is Impossible (15-16)

1. The Jews were God's Blessed People (15)

CONTEXT: Paul's argument to Peter

- a. They received special blessing over other nations
- b. They had and honored God's law
- c. To them, Gentiles were separate category who neglected law
- 2. The Jews cannot be Justified by law (16a)
 - a. Justification is only by faith in Christ
 - b. Even Jews must be justified by faith in Christ
- 3. No one can be justified by works of law (16b)
 - a. There is no man good enough
 - b. There is no man who has kept law
- B. Justification by Law Denies the Gospel of Christ (17-18)
 - 1. Rejecting Law for Justification Reveals our sin (17)
 - a. Denying Justification by Law admits one's sin
 - i. If Law justifies you must keep it
 - ii. If you can't it can't justify
 - iii. If you seek justification in Christ admit sin
 - b. Denying Justification by Law admits Christ's righteousness
 - i. Christ is not a minister of sin
 - ii. Christ is fulfillment of the law
 - iii. Christ does not call us to sin
 - 2. Returning to Law for Justification Destroys Gospel (18)
 - a. Rebuilding works righteousness is Fatal
 - i. It returns us to an impossible system
 - ii. It prove us to be criminals
- II. Living as if Justified in Christ Reflects the Gospel (19-21)
 - A. Justification is in Union With Christ (19-20a)
 - 1. The Law Brings Death
 - 2. The Believer Died Christ's death
 - a. We died in union with Him
 - b. We were crucified and paid the price for sin
 - c. Christ was resurrected in us
 - d. Christ Lives in us
 - B. Justification through Law Invalidates Christ's Sacrifice (20b-21)
 - 1. The Believer Lives by Christ's Faithfulness (Faith of Christ)
 - 2. The Believer Cannot exchange Grace for Law in Justification

- a. To do so nullifies Christ's death
- b. Christ didn't need to die if it were possible to keep law
