## The Blessings of Job (Job 1:1-5)

- I. Job was a Man Devoted to God (1)
  - a. Job was blameless before God
    - 1. Not sinless, but upright in God's sight
  - b. Job's heart made him upright (Job 28:28)
    - 1. Fearing God
      - i. When you fear God, you fear nothing else
      - ii. When you don't fear God, you fear everything
    - 2. Turning away from evil
- II. Job was a Man Blessed by God (2-3)
  - a. Job had a large family (2)

## blessing from God - Gen. 12:2; 13:16; 30:1

- 1. Seven sons, three daughters
- 2. Family is a blessing from God
- b. Job had many possessions (3)
  - 1. He had much livestock
  - 2. He had many servants
  - 3. He was very rich -

## He used his wealth for good - 29:12–17; 31:16–32

c. Job was the greatest of all men in the east

morally, spiritually, materially, socially

- III. Job Committed His Family to God (4-5)
  - a. Job's Children enjoyed Job's blessings (4)
    - 1. They feasted every day at different houses
    - 2. Life was nothing but pleasure
  - b. Job honored God and cared for his family (5)
    - 1. Job Petitioned God for his children

## maybe he didn't like their over-indulgence men pray for their families

- i. He consecrated them to God
- ii. He diligently offered sacrifice for them
  - (every morning) (them all)
- 2. Job cared about his children's relationship to God
  - i. He worried about their sin
  - ii. He worried about them cursing God secretly
  - iii. He worried they would offend God irreverently
- 3. Job did these things continually
