- I. True Wisdom Is Unappreciated by Man (1-13a)
 - A. Men Pursues What is Valuable to Him (1-11)
 - 1. Men Always Search out What He Values (1-3)
 - a. Valuable Minerals are Found in the Earth (1-2)
 - i. There are mines for silver and gold (1)
 - ii. Iron and Copper are taken from the earth (2)
 - b. Men Search out Valuable Minerals (3)
 - i. Man will find these minerals even in darkness
 - ii. He will find a way to end the darkness and search to the farthest limit of the gloom
 - iii. Nothing will stop him from seeking that which he values
 - 2. Valuable Things may Be in Difficult Places (4-8)
 - a. The Places minerals are found are hard to locate (4)
 - i. They are in the most remote place away from where people live and forgotten by travelers
 - ii. They are far from all mankind, hanging high in the air
 - b. The Places minerals are found are unknown to creation
 - i. The earth produces food but is turned up as by fire (5)
 - ii. Gold and Sapphires lie in the dust and stones
 - iii. Yet the birds have not seen it they place no value in the gold and the gems
 - iv. The beasts and the lion have passed over it
 - v. It is not valuable to them and it is not found by them. It is well hidden.
 - 3. Man Searches for Valuables with Great Energy (9-11)
 - a. Man will Dig Until He Finds what is Valuable (9-10)
 - i. He puts his hand to the flinty rock
 - ii. He overturns the mountains themselves
 - iii. He cuts channels through the rocks
 - iv. He will find what is precious to him
 - b. Man will Do Whatever it Takes to Find what is Valuable
 - i. He dams up the streams
 - ii. Whatever is hidden, man will bring into the light
 - iii. He will find what he sets his heart upon
 - B. Man does Not Realize the Value of Wisdom (12-13a)
 - 1. The Place of Wisdom and Understanding is Hidden (12)
 - 2. Man Does Not Realize the Value of Wisdom (13a)
- II. True Wisdom Is More Valuable and Remote than Anything (13b-19)
 - A. Wisdom is Not Found Even in the Most Remote Places (13b-14)
 - 1. Wisdom can't be found in the land of the living (13b)
 - 2. Wisdom is not found in the depths of the earth (14)

- 3. Wisdom is not found in the depths of the sea
- B. Wisdom is More Valuable than Anything (15-19)
 - 1. Wisdom cannot be bought for any price (15-16)
 - a. It can't be bought for gold
 - b. It can't be bought for any amount of silver
 - c. It cannot be valued in any precious material (16)
 - 2. Wisdom Cannot be Equaled in Value (17-19)
 - a. Gold and glass cannot compare to it
 - b. No material can be exchanged for it
 - c. Crystal and coral can't buy it
 - d. Pearls cannot equal it
 - e. Topaz and pure gold cannot equal it
- III. Wisdom Abides with God Alone (20-28)
 - A. Wisdom Cannot be Found (20-22)
 - 1. Where does wisdom and understanding come from?
 - 2. Wisdom is hidden from the eyes of the living
 - 3. Wisdom is concealed from the birds of the air
 - 4. Wisdom cannot even be found by death and the destroyer
 - B. God Alone Know Wisdom (23-24)
 - 1. God understands the way to wisdom
 - 2. God knows its place
 - 3. God sees everything under the heavens
 - C. God Alone Establishes Wisdom (25-27)
 - 1. God created all things as well as wisdom
 - 2. God declared wisdom and established it
 - 3. God searched out wisdom
 - D. God Alone Reveals Wisdom to Man (28)
 - 1. God reveals that the fear of God is the beginning of wisdom
 - 2. God reveals that to turn from evil is to have understanding
