 - A. Pray for God's Glory (2)
 - 1. Hallowed be your name
 - B. Pray for God's Rule
 - 1. Your kingdom come
 - C. Pray for God's Provision (3)
 - 1. Our DAILY bread
 - D. Pray for God's Forgiveness
 - E. Pray for God's Correction
 - 1. as we forgive others
 - F. Pray for God's Protection (4)
 - 1. Lead us away from temptation
- II. Pray Without Ceasing (5-10)
 - A. Man's Persistent Request prevails with other men (5-8)
 - 1. A Man's Request is Denied (5-7)
 - a. A request is made for bread at midnight (5-6)
 - i. Proper manners to provide for guests
 - ii. Insulting to deny them a meal
 - b. The Request is denied (7)
 - i. The door is shut
 - ii. The family is asleep
 - iii. It would be very inconvenient to rise and get bread
 - 2. A Persistent Man's Request is Granted (8)
 - a. Even though the man is denied
 - b. The neighbor gives bread because of his persistence
 - c. Not out of love but out of necessity
 - B. Persistent Prayer to God is Efficacious (9-10)
 - 1. Persistently Ask and it will be given (9)
 - a. "keep asking" present active verb continuous aspect
 - 2. Persistently Seek and you will find
 - a. "keep seeking"
 - 3. Persistently Knock and it will be opened to you
- III. Pray With Expectation (11-13)
 - A. Earthly Fathers don't give Harmful gifts
 - 1. If the son asks for a fish he won't give a serpent
 - 2. If the son asks for an egg he won't give a scorpion
 - a. Out of love, earthly fathers will give good to their children
 - B. The Heavenly Father Will not withhold good gifts (13)
 - 1. Earthly men are inherently evil and they treat their kids good
 - 2. How much more does the heavenly father do so.
 - a. He gives the Holy Spirit
 - b. The holy spirit is the source of all things good
 - c. There is nothing that can be asked for which the holy spirit cannot provide.

etc.	d. He gives righteousness, forgiveness, adoption, redemption
