## The Divine Authority of Christ (Luke 11:14-23)

- I. Jesus' Divine Authority is Rejected (14-16)
  - A. Jesus exercises authority over a mute demon (14)
    - 1. The people marveled
    - 2. The miracle was uncontestable
    - 3. There was no doubt that he had done the work
  - B. Jesus' Authority is Questioned (15-16)
    - 1. The miracle was undeniable so the source of his power was questioned.
      - a. Some attributed his work to Beelzebul (Lord of the house)
      - b. Some desire a sign from heaven to prove his authority (16)
        - i. This is the opposite of faith
        - ii. It still continues today, instead of trusting we seek proof before we will accept
- II. Jesus Answers the Question of Authority (17-18)
  - A. No Kingdom fighting itself can stand (17)
    - 1. Why would Satan be warring against his own?
    - 2. Why would He be casting out his own demons?
    - 3. He would be destroying His own kingdom.
  - B. Satan does not fight against himself (18)
    - 1. He is very good at being a devil
    - 2. He desires to kill, steal and destroy
    - 3. He does not seek the benefit of people
- III. Jesus' Authority Brings Judgment (18b-20)
  - A. Judgment will come on those rejecting Christ (18b-19)
    - 1. The Pharisees were hypocritically judging Christ
      - a. Their own sons were casting out demons also
      - b. How could the Pharisees condemn him for it
    - 2. The Pharisees disciples would become their judges
      - a. If Iesus was working by the devil then so were the Pharisees
    - 3. If Jesus is Messiah, working through God
      - a. Then He is truly from God
      - b. Then the Kingdom of God has come
      - c. Then the Pharisees were condemning God's own work
- IV. Jesus' Authority is Unconquerable (21-22)
  - A. A strong man can protect his house (21)
    - 1. Jesus was referring to Satan as the strong man protecting his kingdom
      - a. He rules his kingdom and protects his own
      - b. He watches over his own goods
      - c. He does not let others waltz in and take what they want
  - B. Only a stronger one can overcome Him (22)
    - 1. Jesus was the stronger man who came to raid Satan's kingdom
      - a. He has taken away his armor
      - b. He has divided his spoil

- V. Jesus' Authority Demands a Response (23)
  - A. Whoever is not with Christ is against him
    - 1. There is no middle ground
      - a. you either accept Christ and his authority or you don't
      - b. you cannot straddle the fence
      - c. indifference is to choose the other side
  - B. Whoever does not gather with Christ scatters
    - 1. Christ alone brings the children of God together
    - 2. There are no other routes to God
    - 3. everyone without Christ is cast away from the Father.
