True Cleanness and Uncleanness Before God (Luke 11:37-54)

- I. True Cleanness Before God (37-41)
 - A. Jesus Breaks Tradition Regarding Cleanness (37-38)
 - 1. Jesus is invited to dine with a Pharisee (37)
 - 2. Jesus did not wash before dinner (38)
 - a. The Pharisee was shocked
 - b. Jesus defied Religious tradition regarding cleanness
 - B. Jesus Warns Regarding Religious Cleanness (39)
 - 1. The Pharisees Only cared about outward religion
 - 2. The Pharisees were more concerned about tradition
 - 3. The Pharisees did not care about their sin
 - C. Jesus Shows the True Nature of Cleanness (40-41)
 - 1. God Desires the Inside and the Outside (40)
 - a. God created both inside and outside
 - i. He created all things for His glory
 - ii. The inside must glorify Him as well
 - b. God desires the inside of man (41)
 - i. When the inside is clean every part is clean
 - ii. The inside always comes out

- II. The Uncleanness of Religion (42-44)
 - A. Outward Righteousness Alone brings Judgment (42)
 - 1. Jesus pronounces woe on the Pharisees
 - 2. Jesus demands inward and outward righteousness
 - a. The Pharisees kept the outward righteousness
 - i. They tithed min and rue and herb
 - b. The Pharisees neglected inward righteousness
 - ii. Iustice
 - iii. the Love of (for) God
 - B. Outward Righteousness that comes from within is commended
 - 1. Jesus said the Pharisees were right to tithe
 - 2. Jesus said they must also not neglect the inward aspect
 - C. Outward Righteousness Alone Leads to Defiling Pride (43-44)
 - 1. Jesus pronounces woe on the prideful (43)
 - a. The Pharisees desired the best seats in synagogue
 - b. The Pharisees desired the greeting in marketplace
 - c. The Pharisees desired to be honored by men
 - 2. Jesus warns of the defilement of the prideful (44)
 - a. The Pharisees were like unmarked graves
 - b. People walked over them without knowing
 - c. To come in contact with a grave was defiling
 - d. Unmarked graves defiled people without them knowing

- III. The Uncleanness of Spurning God's Word (45-52)
 - 1. Woe to those who don't practice what they preach (45-46)
 - a. A lawyer is insulted by Jesus' accusations
 - b. Jesus pronounces woe on the lawyers (46)
 - i. They load the people with burdens
 - ii. They don't life a finger to bear these burdens
 - They held people to a different standard
 - They added to God's Word
 - They made their laws equal to God's
 - 2. Woe to those who refuse the Word of God (47-48)
 - a. They build honored tombs of the prophets (47)
 - i. It was their fathers who refused the prophets words
 - ii. It was their fathers who killed the prophets
 - They refused the prophets words
 - b. They Equally refuse God's word (48)
 - i. They equally refuse the prophet's words
 - ii. They build tombs for them
 - iii. They consent to their father's actions
 - 3. Woe to those who Consent to refusing the Word of God (49-51)
 - a. God foretold the murder of his prophets
 - i. He chose to send prophets to be murdered
 - b. God requires retribution upon this generation
 - i. The blood of all the prophets are required of this generation
 - c. God holds their fathers sins against them because they consent
 - 4. Woe to those who Rebel and Hinder others from God (52)
 - a. The lawyers have taken away the key of knowledge
 - i. They have left God's word for their own
 - ii. They held others to that standard
 - They did not received God
 - They hindered others from coming
- IV. Uncleanness Brings Devastating Results (53-54)
 - 1. Uncleanness Hardens the Heart to God's Word
 - a. The Pharisees sought to trap Jesus in His Words
 - i. They began to press him hard
 - ii. They desired to catch him in his Words
 - b. Their hearts were hardened to God's word
 - i. They refused it and looked for loopholes
