God is patient with the guilty – Luke 13:1-9

- I. Punishment is Deserved (1-5)
 - A. Is God's Punishment Always Due to Extraordinary Sin? (1-2; 4-5)
 - 1. Jesus is asked about the suffering of religious men (1)
 - a. Pilate had killed Galileans giving sacrifices
 - b. They were doing what was right (Judaism)
 - c. They couldn't understand why God allowed them to die
 - 2. Jesus asks them about the Galilean's sinfulness (2)
 - a. Do you think they were worse sinners than others?
 - b. Do you think they died because they were bad?
 - 3. Jesus asks them about others involved in an accident (4)
 - a. There were eighteen involved in an accident
 - b. The tower of Siloam fell on them
 - c. Jesus showed them men who died for no reason (seemingly)
 - d. Were they worse sinners than other people?
 - B. All Men Deserve the Punishment Of God (3, 5)
 - 1. Jesus said, unless you repent, you will also perish
 - 2. The question is "why didn't it happen to me."
 - a. Because of sin, man deserves the worst circumstances
 - b. The fact that we live daily without tragedy

is God's act of mercy

- II. Patience is Delivered (6-9) The Parable of the Fruitless Tree
 - A. The Tree is Found Fruitless (6-7)
 - 1. The fig tree was bearing no fruit (6)
 - a. The owner came to the tree he planted
 - God has created and owns us
 - We are to bear fruit for Him
 - b. The owner found no fruit on the tree
 - 2. The fig tree had never bore fruit (7a)
 - a. The owner had sought fruit for three years
 - Sinners can do nothing good for God
 - Sinners can do nothing righteous
 - Every good they do is stained with sin
 - 3. The fig tree is worthless (7b)
 - a. The owner said cut it down
 - b. It was using up the ground
 - Sinners deserve judgment
 - At any moment, God would be right to bring judgment
 - God would be good to do so
 - B. The Vinedresser Intercedes for the Tree (8-9)
 - 1. The Vinedresser asks for Time to Nurture the Tree (8)
 - a. He wants to dig around the tree
 - b. He wants to fertilize the tree
 - Christ intercedes for us as well
 - Every time we sin, Christ intercedes

- God is patient because of the atonement
- He is continually working
- 2. The Vinedresser will Work and then assess the tree
 - a. There will come a time when it is too late
 - b. Christ works, Holy Spirit draws, seeking fruit
 - Conversion, repentance, salvation
 - c. There will come a day when either fruit or cut down
 - d. Could be today
