Jesus Demonstrates Love over Religion – Luke 13:10-17

- I. Jesus Heals on The Sabbath (10-13)
 - A. A Disabled Woman Heard Jesus on The Sabbath (10-11)
 - 1. Jesus was teaching in a synagogue (10)
 - 2. A woman with a disabling spirit was there listening (11)
 - a. She had it for 18 years
 - b. She was bent over and unable to straighten up
 - She was in Church
 - She sought God despite her infirmity
 - B. The Disabled Woman is Healed (12-13)
 - 1. Jesus pronounces the woman free (12)
 - a. You are free from your disability
 - b. Jesus speaks the word and she is released
 - 2. Jesus touches her and she is healed (13)
 - a. Jesus lays His hands on her and she straightens immediately
 - C. The Disabled Woman Glorified God (13b)
 - 1. The Episode led to God's Glory
 - 2. Jesus' work on the Sabbath was to the glory of God
 - 3. Jesus' work on the Sabbath was for love of the woman
- II. Jesus Exposes Useless Religion (14-17)
 - A. The Synagogue's Ruler Admonishes The People (14)
 - 1. He was mad because Jesus broke tradition
 - 2. He told them they should come other days to be healed
 - 3. He said healing should not be done on the Sabbath.
 - B. Jesus Reveals the Hypocrisy of Religion (15-16)
 - 1. Jesus showed that the religious men also work on the Sabbath (15)
 - a. Their tradition allowed for their own well being
 - b. Their tradition didn't allow for helping others
 - c. Today, others sins look worse than our own
 - d. Easy to condemn others and do similar things
 - 2. Jesus showed that love is greater than religion (16)
 - a. Satan had bound the woman 18 years
 - b. He calls her daughter of Abraham
 - c. Tradition should not stop her from being helped
 - Many of our set ways get in the way of the work
 - We won't let go of tradition to do God's work
 - Us four and no more
 - C. The Religious were Shamed and God Glorified (17)
 - 1. His adversaries could not deny the charge
 - a. They also worked on the Sabbath
 - b. They worked for their own benefit
 - 2. The people glorified God
 - a. They rejoiced in the woman's healing
 - b. They rejoiced in the work of Christ.
