## Counting The Cost of Discipleship – Luke 14:25-35

- I. The Cost of Discipleship (25-27)
  - A. Jesus Addresses the Multitude (25)
    - 1. Great crowds accompanied him
    - 2. He spoke to them all
    - 3. This is an address for all who would follow Him
    - 4. This is for everyone who names the name of Christ
  - B. Jesus said Man Must Love Christ Over All Else (26)
    - 1. The one who comes to me meaning one who wants to follow me
      - a. speaks of those who want Christ
      - b. speaks of those who want eternal life
      - c. speaks of those who want God's blessing
    - 2. He must Love Christ with an Extraordinary Love
      - a. A love that makes parental love look like hate
      - b. A love that makes family love look like hate
      - c. A love that makes self-love look like hate
      - d. Cannot contradict 5<sup>th</sup> commandment (father /mother)
        - i. Means love Christ more than all others things
        - ii. Must love Him more than what we love most
        - iii. Gen. 29:30 loved Rachael more than Leah

nest verse - Leah was hated

- e. The claims our families make on us cannot override His
- f. Unless He is our affection, we cannot be disciples
- C. Jesus said Man Must Die to Himself (27)
  - 1. Cross carrier was a condemned man death sentence
    - a. They had seen plenty of crucifixions one way trip
    - b. Are you willing to go and die with me?
    - c. Multitude wanted blessing, no one wanted to follow
      - endure suffering
      - endure persecution
      - endure trial
    - d. If I am not willing to die for him, I'm not willing to live 4 him
    - e. I give up claim to myself I die He lives in me
- II. You Must Count the Cost of Discipleship (28-33)
  - A. No One Acts Without Counting The Cost (28-32)
    - 1. No one sets out to build without planning (28-29)
      - a. Otherwise he may not be able to finish
      - b. He may start well, but not have resources, manpower
    - 2. No King goes to war without planning (30-32)
      - a. He counts his options before going to war
      - b. He makes peace if he cannot prevail
  - B. You Cannot Follow Without Counting the Cost (33)
    - 1. The disciple must weigh the options
      - a. No one can come unless he renounces all he has
      - b. Is it worth it?

- c. Easy to say yes when comfortable
- III. The Unmindful Disciple is Useless
  - A. Salt Without Flavor Can't Be Re-salted (34-35)
    - 1. If Salt has lost its taste it is no longer salt
      - a. Salt is what flavors
      - b. Nothing can flavor salt
      - c. Salt without flavor is sand
    - 2. Salt without Flavor is Useless (35)
      - a. Can't salt food
      - b. Can't kill plants along the road
      - c. Can't preserve nutrients in manure for crops
        - not worth crap
  - B. The Disciple who is Half-hearted is Useless
    - 1. He cannot follow Christ
    - 2. He cannot endure persecution
    - 3. He cannot leave worldliness
