Jesus has just finished scolding the people about their use of worldly wealth. He finished by challenging their relationship with God. You can't serve God and money.

 - A. The Pharisees Justify Their Love of Money (14-15a)
 - 1. The greedy Pharisees ridiculed him (14)
 - a. They heard his teaching on money
 - b. They loved money
 - c. They ridiculed Him
 - Money was seen as sign of righteousness
 - Wealth was seen as sign of blessing
 - 2. The greedy Pharisees Justified Themselves (15a)
 - a. They looked for loopholes
 - b. They had good arguments
 - c. They wanted God and money
 - B. God Alone Justifies (15b)
 - 1. God knows the heart
 - a. This is NOT a good thing
 - b. Sin comes from the heart Matt. 15:18-19
 - 2. God judges the reality
 - a. Man looks and sees goodness, righteousness
 - b. God looks and sees abomination
 - C. No one Will be justified

 - 1. Full Revelation of Salvation Has come
 - a. Before the Law and the Prophets foreshadowed it
 - b. Now the Kingdom is Preached

 - 1. The Law of God will Never Become Void (17)
 - a. Heaven and Earth will pass before the Law
 - 2. Divorce and Adultery Are Still Unlawful (18)
