 - A. A blind beggar hears a commotion (35-36)
 - 1. He was sitting by the road begging (35)
 - a. All he could do
 - b. No help for the disabled
 - 2. He heard the crowd
 - 3. He inquired about the commotion
- II. The Blind Beggar's Persistent Faith (38-39)
 - A. The Beggar called out to Jesus
 - 1. Son of David = The Messiah, Heir to Throne
 - 2. He cried for Mercy
 - B. Others Tried to Silence Him (39a)
 - 1. Many rebuked him
 - 2. They told him to shut up
 - C. The Beggar was Persistent (39b)
 - 1. He refused to be silenced
 - 2. He knew this was his only chance
 - a. He believed Jesus was the one
 - b. He knew only Jesus could help
 - c. He refused to give up
 - 3. He continued to cry out
- III. Jesus Delivers the Faithful (40-43)
 - A. Jesus Responds to the Beggar's Persistent Faith (40-41)
 - 1. Jesus Received the Blind Beggar (40)
 - a. Jesus stopped
 - b. Jesus commanded him to be brought
 - 2. Jesus Asked the Most Important Question (40b-41)
 - a. What do you want me to do for you?
 - b. Man must know His predicament
 - B. The Beggar is Transformed (41b-43)
 - 1. The Beggar is Made Whole Through Faith (41b-43a)
 - a. The Beggar Responded in Faith
 - i. He called Him Lord
 - ii. He wanted His sight returned
 - iii. Spiritual darkness
 - b. The Beggar was Delivered through faith (42-43a)
 - i. Jesus said recover your sight
 - ii. Your faith has "saved" "delivered" you
 - in context translated "made well"
 - iii. his sight is recovered
 - C. The Beggar's Transformation Changed His Walk (43b)
 - 1. He followed Christ
 - 2. He glorified God
 - a. The people gave glory to God seeing Him.
