- I. Jesus Passes By a Sinner (1-3a)
 - A. Jesus was passing through Jericho (1)
 - B. Jesus is sought by a great sinner (who he was)(2-3a)
 - 1. A Rich tax-collector named Zacchaeus (sinful-outcast) (2)
 - 2. A Rich tax-collector sought Jesus (3a)
- II. Jesus and Zacchaeus Had a Divine Appointment (3b-7)
 - A. Zacchaeus Would Not Be Dissuaded (3b-4)

Jamie in airport

- 1. Zacchaeus is hindered from seeing Jesus (3)
- 2. Zacchaeus forsook dignity and pride to see Jesus (4)
 - a. He ran to where Jesus would be
 - b. He climbed up a sycamore tree to see him
- B. Jesus Would not be Dissuaded (5-7)
 - 1. Jesus Came to Zacchaeus (5-6a)
 - a. Jesus Looked up at Him (intentional-appointment)
 - b. Jesus commanded him to come down
 - c. Jesus invited himself to his house (eat with sin)
 - 2. Religion would Hinder Jesus From Going (6-7)
 - a. Zacchaeus obeyed joyfully (6)
 - b. The self-righteous grumbled (7)
- III. Jesus Came To Save Sinners (8-10)
 - A. Zacchaeus is Saved and Transformed (8-9)
 - 1. Zacchaeus' Life Demonstrates his salvation (8)
 - a. Zacchaeus gave half his goods to poor
 - b. Zacchaeus returned what he had stolen
 - 2. Jesus Affirmed Zacchaeus' salvation (9)
 - B. Zacchaeus was the kind of man Jesus came for (10)
