The Rejection of Jesus' Authority – Luke 20:9-18

- I. Men Reject the Authority of God (parable)(9-12)
 - A. The man gave authority of his vineyard to tenants (9)
 - 1. He planted the vineyard (God created)
 - 2. He gave the use of it to tenants
 - 3. He was going away
 - B. The man wanted a part of the harvest (10a)
 - 1. He sent a servant in his name
 - 2. He sent him to collect "some" fruit
 - C. The man's authority is rejected (10b)
 - 1. They beat the servant
 - 2. They sent him away with nothing
 - D. The man's authority is repeatedly rejected (11-13)
 - 1. The Grace of the owner
 - a. He sent two more servants
 - b. He simply wanted what was his
 - 2. The Rebellion of the tenants
 - a. They beat the servants
 - b. They treated them shamefully
 - c. They sent them away with nothing
- II. Men Reject the Opportunity of God (13-15)
 - A. The owner sent his son to the tenants (13)
 - 1. "I will send my beloved son"
 - 2. "Surely they will respect him"
 - a. The son represented the owner's authority
 - b. He came in authority, not as a servant
 - B. The tenants reject and kills the son (14-15a)
 - 1. They recognized the son
 - 2. They decided to kill him
 - 3. They decided to take his inheritance
 - 4. They threw him out of the vineyard
- III. God Rejects the Authority of Man (15b-18)
 - A. The owner's wrath is displayed (15b-16a)
 - 1. The owner comes and destroys them
 - 2. The owner gives the vineyard to others
 - B. The People would not accept God's rejection
 - 1. The Jews didn't think God would reject them
 - C. Jesus shows them the truth (17-18)
 - 1. Jesus demonstrated this truth from their scriptures
 - a. The builders reject the cornerstone
 - b. They are broken over the stone
 - c. They are crushed by the stone
