 - 1. The Religious Testifies Against Jesus (1-2)
 - a. He is misleading the nation
 - b. He is forbidding payment of taxes
 - c. He is claiming to be a king
 - d. He is ruining society and people's lives
 - 2. Jesus Testifies to His Kingship (3)
 - a. Jesus confirms He is a king
 - b. Jesus confirms His true authority (John 18:37)
 - 3. Pilate Testifies to Jesus' Innocence (4)
 - a. No guilt is found
 - b. Pilate knew He did nothing worth condemnation
 - c. His conscience told Him who Jesus was
 - 4. Religious Testify Against Jesus (5)
 - a. They continually insisted
 - b. They accused Him of stirring up ppl
 - B. Pilate Refuses to Decide (6-7)
 - 1. Pilate finds a way out Galilean?
 - 2. Pilate sends Him to Herod
 - 3. Pilate doesn't want to make a stand
 - 4. Pilate fears for his job and life
 - a. Caesar told him, no more riots
- II. Decision is Refused (8-13)
 - A. Herod is Refused the Benefits of Jesus (8-9)
 - 1. Herod Desired a Miracle (8)
 - a. He was glad to see Jesus
 - b. He had heard of lesus
 - c. He wanted a sign from Jesus
 - 2. Jesus refused to speak to Herod (9)
 - a. Herod wanted a trick
 - b. Herod is refused
 - B. Herod Refuses to Decide (10-11)
 - 1. Religious continue their accusation (10)
 - 2. Herod mocked and returned Him (11)
 - 3. Rather than decide Herod deferred
 - 4. Jesus would not perform for Him
 - C. Those Refusing to Decide actually decide against (12)
 - 1. Herod and Pilate became friends
 - 2. Herod and Pilate were enemies
 - 3. Herod and Pilate shared their refusal to decide
- III. Decision is Demanded (13-25)
 - A. No Fault is Found in Jesus (13-17)

- 1. Pilate declares His innocence (13-14)
- 2. Herod had implied His innocence (15)
- 3. Pilate decides to release Him
 - a. Punish Him to appease the crowd
- B. The Crowd Forces Pilate's Hand (18-25)
 - 1. Religious Refuse to Release Jesus
 - a. They cried for Barabbas the Murderer
 - b. Pilate attempts to release Him again
 - 2. Pilate gives in to their Demand
- IV. Decision is Demanded for You
 - A. One cannot "Ride the Fence" about Jesus
 - 1. The World cries out against His Word
 - 2. We cannot be indifferent
 - 3. Our hand will be forced
