 - 1. Jesus returned to Galilee in the Spirit's Power (14)
 - 2. Jesus' reputation spread far and wide (15)
 - 3. Jesus' teaching was glorified by many (15)
 - Today Jesus is Lauded as a great man, teacher
 - Anyone who values love values Jesus
 - Yet many misunderstand His message
 - B. Jesus' Message is Convicting (v. 16-30)
 - 1. The Gospel of Faith is Doubted (v. 16-24)
 - a. Jesus Proclaims the Gospel to the Nazarenes (16-21)
 - i. He began to teach in His hometown (16)
 - ii. He taught from the Isaiah Scroll (17)
 - b. Jesus Announces His Mission (18-19)
 - i. To Preach good news to the Poor (18)
 - ii. To free the captives and Heal the Blind (19)
 - iii. To free the oppressed
 - iv. To declare God's Grace
 - sounds good right? Amen, Amen
 - c. Jesus Taught that this was fulfilled Today (20-21)
 - i. He sat (teaching position)
 - ii. It was fulfilled in their hearing
 - iii. They were the poor, blind, and oppressed
 - iv. They didn't realized their condition
 - v. Blind to Lostness, oppressed by sin and law
 - d. Jesus' Message is Acknowledged but Doubted (22-24)
 - i. At first they marveled at His Word (22)
 - they didn't realize he was talking about them
 - ii. Then They required proof He was Messiah (23-24)
 - they were too familiar
 - Isn't this Joseph's Son
 - We grow up around "Jesus"
 - + They wanted a miracle as proof (23)
 - + They were too familiar with Him (24)
 - 2. The Gospel is Rejected (v. 25-30)
 - a. The Message Offends them (25-29)
 - i. Jesus Condemns their Lack of Faith (25-28)
 - The Example of Elijah and the Widow (25-26)
 - Many widows received nothing
 - She had faith before she saw
 - Believed Elijah and Lived
 - The Example of Namaan the Syrian (27)
 - Many Israeli Lepers were not healed
 - Namaan (Gentile) believed and was

- ii. They became angry with Jesus (28)
 - We are oppressed?
 - We are in need?
 - We are no better than Namaan a Gentile?
- iii. They tried to Kill Him (29-30)
 - Drove him to a cliff
- 3. The People Were Rejected (30)
 - a. Jesus left them
 - He did not beg or plead
 - He did not try to convince
 - He left.
