## The Righteousness of Christ (Luke 5:33-39)

- I. Man Desires His Own Righteousness (33-35)
  - A. Religious Men Keep Religious Rituals (33)
    - 1. Pharisees and John's Disciples fast
    - 2. Jesus' Disciples don't fast
      - a. The only fast required was day of atonement (Lev. 23:27)
      - b. They fasted 2x week to add to righteousness
  - B. Religious Ritual Does Not Bring Righteousness (34-35)
    - 1. Fasting is suspended during wedding weeks (34)
      - a. Jesus shows them that it is ritual
      - b. They don't fast during wedding ceremonies
        - Jesus understood that their fasts were only ritual
    - 2. Fasting Should be From Heartfelt Devotion (35)
      - a. Jesus said his disciples will fast
      - b. The disciples fast will be from the heart not ritual
- II. Jesus Brings a New Righteousness (36-39)
  - A. Jesus' Parable of the Old and New (36-38)
    - 1. The New Cannot Simply Be added to the Old (36-38)
      - a. Man Won't Destroy a New Garment to Fix an Old (36)
        - i. Both would Be ruined
      - b. Man Won't Waste New Wine In Old Skins (37-38)
        - i. Wine Expands as it ages
        - ii. New Skins stretch with the Wine
        - iii. Old stretched skins burst
  - B. Men Desire to Keep Their Old Ways
    - 1. They want to Work for their righteousness
    - 2. They won't see themselves as wretched
  - C. You Can't add Jesus onto a works system
    - 1. Anything but Jesus is worthless
    - 2. To combine the two is to destroy both.
