## Faith in the Midst of Hopelessness (Luke 8:40-56)

- I. A Hopeless Man Comes in Faith (40-42)
  - A. A Crowd Waited For Jesus (40)
    - 1. they all had wants and needs
    - 2. They all wanted see something miraculous
    - 3. Many today come for the spectacle
  - B. Jairus Came Pleading for His Daughter (41-42a)
    - 1. He came humbly in faith (41)
      - a. Fell at Jesus feet
      - b. Begged him to come to his house
        - i. Knew Jesus was the only hope
        - ii. Trusted that he could save her
    - 2. His Daughter was dying (42)
  - C. Jesus Went as the Crowd Pressed in (42b)
    - 1. Imagine Jairus "Get out of the way" Move
    - 2. The crowd was after novelty and spectacle
    - 3. Jairus had a real need
- II. A Hopeless Woman Comes in Faith (43-48)
  - A. A hopeless woman is healed (43-44)
    - 1. A woman was ill with no hope of healing (43)
      - a. She had been sick 12 years
      - b. No doctors could help her
      - c. She had spent all she had on doctors
    - 2. The woman touched Jesus and was healed (44)
      - a. She touched the fringe of his garment
      - b. She was healed immediately
  - B. The Woman's Faith in Christ Heals the Woman (45-48)
    - 1. The Woman would not be healed in Secret (45-47)
      - a. Jesus perceived the healing (45)
        - i. He knew someone had touched him in faith
          - surrounded by a crowd seeking nothing more than to see a miracle, he felt her faith
        - ii. He felt her being healed (46)
          - He felt the power go out of him
      - b. The Woman humbly fell before Him (47)
        - i. She confessed her need
        - ii. She confessed her faith
        - iii. She confessed what Jesus did for her
    - 2. Jesus Healed the Woman Through Faith (48)
      - a. You faith has made you well
      - b. Not only faith, but faith in Christ
- III. Those of Faith see the Miracle of God (49-56)
  - A. Only those of Faith see the Miracle (49-53)
    - 1. Jesus commands faith in the midst of hopelessness (49-50)
      - a. Jesus is told of the daughter's death (49)

- i. All hope is gone
- ii. If that woman wouldn't have stopped us
- iii. It's all over
- b. Jesus commands faith (50)
  - i. Do not Fear
  - ii. Only Believe
  - iii. And she will be well
- c. There is no such thing as hopelessness
  - i. Rom. 8:28
- 2. Jesus Excludes the unbelievers from the miracle (51-53)
  - a. Jesus allows only a select group in the house (51)
  - b. Those outside the house wept (52)
    - i. They could only continue in hopelessness
