## The Cost of Discipleship (Luke 9:23-27)

- I. The Qualities of Discipleship (23)
  - A. The Disciple Must Deny Himself
    - 1. "Let him" is 3<sup>rd</sup> person imperative
    - 2. Not "he should" but "he must"
  - B. The Disciple Must Be Sacrificially Devoted
    - 1. Take up His Cross
      - a. This meant death, not hardship
      - b. Everyone knew the sight of a man carrying cross
      - c. Surrounded by Romans One way trip
    - 2. Daily
      - a. This is an everyday thing
      - b. Not a one time thing
      - c. "I got that done when I was 8 yrs old"
      - d. Ongoing sacrifice God produces in heart
- II. The Reason For Discipleship (24-25)
  - A. To lose one's life is to gain life (24)
    - 1. To seek comfort and fulfillment in this life is to lose eternal
    - 2. To lose ownership of life to Christ is gain
    - 3. The reward for temporal loss is eternal gain
  - B. To gain the world is not worth the cost (25)
    - 1. Gaining everything now will mean nothing in eternity
    - 2. Everything will be lost at death
    - 3. Lose life, soul, and self
- III. The Warning of Forsaking Discipleship (26)
  - A. Forsaking Discipleship means Forsaking Christ's Words
    - 1. The one ashamed of Jesus and His words
      - a. This man has not taking up discipleship
    - 2. The Son will be ashamed of those who are not disciples
      - a. One cannot forsake discipleship
      - b. And then expect Christ to be his advocate
- IV. The Reward of Discipleship (27)
  - A. Seeing the Kingdom of God
    - 1. Some standing with Jesus would see it
      - a. Many theories Ascension
      - b. A.D. 70
      - c. The Transfiguration
    - 2. We see the kingdom in rulership of Christ
      - a. He rules from Heaven
      - b. He rules from our Hearts
      - c. Unless you are born again you can't "see" the Kingdom
    - 3. The Servants of the King
      - a. This is what discipleship means
      - b. Those who are disciples are Christians and vice versa
