Joy in the Gospel Alone (Philippians 1:12-20)

- I. Paul's Trials Further the Gospel (12-14)
 - A. Paul Reassures the Philippians (12)
 - 1. His imprisonment is good
 - 2. He doesn't want them depressed
 - 3. He sees gospel as more important
 - B. Paul Evangelizes the Romans (13)
 - 1. The Entire Praetorian (imperial guard)
 - a. Paul is able to witness to them
 - b. Paul is able to live before them
 - 2. Everyone Else (everyone he contacts)
 - a. They all know he is there for Christ
 - b. They know it is for Christ's sake
 - C. Paul Emboldens the Church (14)
 - 1. Believers grow in confidence in the Lord
 - a. They see Paul's imprisonment
 - b. They grow in confidence in God
 - c. They speak the word fearlessly
- II. Paul Rejoices in the Furthering of the Gospel (15-18a)
 - A. All Don't preach for the right reasons (15-17)

Paul even gets trials from people claiming to be christians

- 1. Some preach from envy and rivalry
 - a. They do it from selfish ambition (17)
 - b. They don't do it sincerely
 - c. They try to cause Paul trouble in his situation
- 2. Some preach from love (16)
 - a. They love the gospel
 - b. They know Paul is appointed to defend it
- B. Paul Rejoices that Christ is Preached (18a)
 - 1. Paul's chief concern is the gospel
 - 2. Paul gives no concern to holding office or title
 - 3. Paul is not possessed with his own authority
- III. Paul Rejoices in His Role in the Gospel (18b-20)
 - A. Paul is Confident in His Provision (19)
 - 1. He rejoices in his sure deliverance
 - a. His deliverance is through their prayers
 - b. His deliverance is through the Spirit in Him
 - i. These are provided to strengthen him
 - ii. No matter what else happens
 - 2. He trusts in the power of God through them
 - B. Paul is Confident in His Testimony (20)
 - 1. Paul Desires to Exalt Christ boldly
 - a. no matter what circumstances
 - 2. Paul Desires not to be ashamed in any way
 - 3. Paul Desires this regardless of the outcome

- 4. Paul Desires God's glory more than life
- 5. Paul is Christ's regardless (21)
- IV. Paul Rejoices in His Service to the Body (22-25)
 - A. Paul's Service to the body Glorifies Christ
 - B. Paul's Service is more important than personal desire
 - 1. Life means service to Christ (22a)
 - a. Even if he gets out it means service
 - b. He serves wherever he is
 - 2. Paul is torn between life and death (pressured)
 - a. Death is better for Paul (23)
 - i. "much more better" very emphatic
 - ii. He will be with Christ
 - iii. He will no longer suffer
 - b. Life is More profitable for Philippians (24)
 - i. They need him more urgently
 - ii. They need his service and ministry
 - 3. Paul expects to be used in Service (25)
 - a. He will live because they need him
 - b. He is convinced of their need
 - c. He will continue by their side (paramenw)
 - i. So they will progress in faith and joy
 - C. Paul's Return will glorify Christ
 - 1. They will rejoice in Christ because of His return
 - D. What are we doing for the Kingdom
