The Building Up of God's People (Romans 15)

- I. God is Building His People in the Body (v. 1-6)
 - A. The Provision for God's People (v. 1-4)
 - 1. The Church is Given to Support Believers (v. 1-3)
 - a. Believer's have a duty to build up each other
 - i. The Strong believer has a duty to the weak (v. 1)
 - -. Remember the definitions of strong and weak in ch. 14
 - -. The Strong must do everything in his power not to cause the weak to stumble or sin.
 - -. The Strong must put the needs of the weak before their own pleasure
 - -. They are not to please themselves while harming the conscience of another.
 - b. All Believers have a duty to each other (v. 2)
 - i. We are to please our neighbor rather than ourselves
 - this is in matters of conscience and sin
 - we are to do what edifies them rather than ourselves.

NOTICE: it says we are to do this "for his good" for the purpose of his edification

- c. Believers Must follow Christ's unselfish Example (v. 3)
 - i. Christ did not please himself but gave himself
 - ii. Believers give themselves for the good of others
 - iii. This is laying down ones life (so to speak) for another
- 2. The Scripture is Given to Support Believers (v. 4)
 - a. The things written are for our instruction
 - b. The scripture brings endurance for the believer
 - c. The scripture brings encouragement for the believer
 - d. through these things, the scripture brings hope
- II. God is Unifying His People in the Body (v. 7-13)
 - A. God's People are Being brought Together (7-12)
 - 1. Believers must receive one another (v. 7)
 - a. The same way that believers receive each other despite differences
 - b. Believers receive each other despite race or nationality (i.e. Jew or Gentile)
 - c. Believers receive each other because Christ received us
 - d. Believers bring glory to God by receiving one another
 - 2. Christ Came to Receive all Believers Alike (Jew and Gentile) (8-12)
 - a. Christ came to the Jews in fulfillment of God's promise (v. 8)
 - i. The promises to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob

- b. Christ has come to the Gentiles in fulfillment of God's promise (v. 9-12)
 - i. Paul gives a list of OT promises to the Gentiles
 - ii. v. 9 cited from 2 Sam. 22:50 and Ps. 18:49
 - iii. v. 10 cited from Deut 32:43
 - iv. v. 11 cited from Psalm 117:1
 - v. v. 12 cited from Isa. 11:10

Paul is proving that from the beginning God has designed to call all men to Himself

- B. The Results of Being United in Christ (v. 13)
 - 1. Being filled with all joy and hope in believing
 - 2. Being united in the power of the Holy Spirit to the hope of God
- III. God is Using His People to Build the Body (v. 14-33)
 - A. God uses the Gospel Ministry to Build the Body (v. 14-21)
 - 1. Paul commends the Roman Church's maturity (v. 14)
 - 2. Paul also understands his calling to preach to the Gentiles (v. 15)
 - a. He has spoken boldly in some parts so that they will understand that all men are being called into the body
 - b. He wants them to understand that all nations are being called
 - c. The gospel is making them an acceptable offering to God (v. 16)
 - 3. Paul Glories in God's work through Him to the Gentiles (v. 17-19)
 - 4. Paul's only ambition for God is to preach to the nations (v. 20-21)
 - B. God uses Fellowship to Build the Body (v. 22-24)
 - 1. Paul desires to have fellowship with the Body (v. 22-23)
 - a. Paul wanted to come to them but was hindered by his work
 - b. Paul is completing his work and is excited about coming to fellowship with them.
 - c. Paul understands that fellowship builds up the body
 - 2. Paul desires to be helped by the body (v. 24)
 - a. He not only wants to bless them, but for them to bless him as well.
 - C. God uses the Church Itself to Build the Body (v. 25-33)
 - 1. The Body Supports one another materially (v. 25-27)
 - a. Paul is bringing aid to the impoverished saints in Jerusalem (v. 25)
 - b. Other churches have contributed to their need through Paul (v. 26)
 - c. Paul demonstrates that believers actually "owe" it to one another. The Gentiles have become inheritors with the Jewish believers, therefore they should contribute to aid in their suffering. (v. 27)
 - d. What does this say to us today about our giving? Notice the words Paul uses in v. 27

- 2. The Body Supports one another Prayerfully (v. 28-33)
 - a. Paul makes plans to travel through Rome and see them with the blessings of Christ (v. 28)
 - b. Paul appeals to them to "strive with him" in prayer (v. 30)
 - i. Believers intercede for each other
 - ii. Believers pray for each others needs
 - c. Paul wants them to pray for the mission (v. 31)
 - i. The mission is building up the body
 - ii. The mission is being built up by the body (v. 32)
