## The Overthrow of Death (Romans 5:12-21)

- I. The Power of Death Reigned in the World (12-14)
  - A. Death has infected the world through sin (12)
    - 1. Death Entered Through One Man (Adam)
      - a. Sin Came through Adam
      - b. Death came from sin
    - 2. Death Spread Through the World
      - a. All men sin
      - b. All men die
  - B. Death Proves that sin came before law (13-14)
    - 1. Sin Exists even where there is no given law (13)
    - 2. Death Reigned from Adam to Moses (14)
      - a. There was no written law before Moses
      - b. There was God's standard and the law written on hearts
      - c. (there has always been law, but it had not been recorded yet)
      - d. Their transgression wasn't like Adam's
        - i. Adam was given a law (Don't Eat)
        - ii. Adam was mankind's representative
        - iii. Other men's sin only accounts to them, Adams passed to all
        - iv. As a representative, he was a "type" (foreshadowing) of Christ i.e. As Christ represents believers to the Father, Adam represents all men outside of Christ
- II. The Power of Grace Overcame Death in the World (15-21)
  - A. Grace Intervenes (15-19)
    - 1. The Gift of Grace is Greater than sin and death (15-17)
      - a. The gift is greater than the offence (15)
        - i. The gift isn't like the offence (transgression of Adam)
          - a. Through a man's action, many inherited death
          - b. Through God's Action many will inherit life
          - c. Death (condemnation) spreads by birth you don't need to do anything You are born a sinner
          - d. Life spreads by God's grace through faith
          - e. He takes action
      - b. The gift is more powerful than condemnation (16)
        - i. the gift isn't like the transgression
          - a. Through one transgression many condemned
          - b. Through one act many transgressions were justified.
        - ii. by one transgression death came to all
        - iii. by one act of righteousness all transgressions paid
        - iv. The cross is more powerful than Adam's sin
        - v. The cross is more powerful than all sin
      - c. The gift removes the reign of death (17)

- i. Death reigned through one man's sin
- ii. Those receiving grace in Christ now reign in life
  - a. There is no more death for the believer
  - b. Death is defeated (See John 11:26)
- 2. The Gift and Death are Mediated Through one Act (18-19)
  - a. Through one man's disobedience many made sinners
  - b. Through one man's obedience many made righteous
- B. Grace Now Reigns Rather than Death (20-21)
  - 1. God's Grace Overpowers Sin (20)
    - a. The Law increased the understanding of sin
      - i. People didn't realize the magnitude of sin until the law
      - ii. The law increases man's sinfulness as he realizes the extent to which he breaks God's law
    - b. Where sin increases, Grace abounds more
      - i. There is no sin grace cannot cover
      - ii. There is no sin Christ doesn't atone for
  - 2. God's Grace Reigns Through Christ's Righteousness (21)
    - a. Just like sin reigned through death
    - b. Grace reigns through righteousness
      - i. It is grace through Jesus Christ
      - ii. It is grace by faith
      - iii. It is grace that conquers sin and death
