## Return to Me and I will Return to You – Zech. 1:1-7

- I. The Lord Offers Forgiveness (1-3)
  - A. The Lord was Angry with Israel's Fathers (1-2)
    - 1. Many Israelites had returned from 70 year captivity
    - 2. They came expecting God's Kingdom reestablished
    - 3. They were increasingly disappointed by the times
      - a. They had lost interest in building the temple
      - b. They had lost their spiritual ferver
      - c. They had become complacent and indifferent
    - 4. Zechariah was reminding them from where they came
  - B. The Lord Desires Reconciliation (3)
    - 1. Return to the Lord and he will return to you
      - a. Repentance is required of Israel
      - b. Haggai tells them to return to temple building
        - Blood sacrifice is necessary
        - Turn to Christ
      - b. Turn away from ways and deeds
- II. The Lord Brings Judgment (4-6)
  - A. Israel's Fathers Ignored God's Warnings (4)
    - 1. The prophets of old called Israel to repentance
      - a. Called them to turn from evil ways and deeds
      - b. Called them to turn back to God
    - 2. The Fathers would not heed the prophet's warning
      - a. They would not hear the warning
      - b. They would not pay attention to the warning
  - B. Israel's Fathers Incurred God's Judgment (5-6)
    - 1. The Fathers were killed or captured by pagans (5)
      - a. Rhetorical question Where are they?
    - 2. The Prophets neither live forever
    - 3. Yet the words of God spoken by the prophets overtook fathers (6)
      - a. The Jews thought they were invulnerable
      - b. They were God's chosen people
      - c. Therefore they scoffed at the prophets God sent
      - d. They realized too late how wrong they were
- III. The Lord accepts Repentance (7)
  - A. The people heard Zechariah and repented
    - 1. They accepted that God had judged their wickedness
      - a. Their ways and their deeds
    - 2. They turned to Him
      - a. Haggai says they began building the Temple
      - b. God requires turning from sin
      - c. God requires blood sacrifice to be paid.
        - This would happen in the new Temple
        - For us it happened in Christ
