The Victory and Deliverance of God's People (Zech. 10)

- I. God Calls His People Back To Himself (1-2b)
 - A. Pray to the God who Can Provide (1)
 - 1. Ask the Lord for rain
 - 2. It is the Lord who makes the storm clouds
 - 3. The Lord will bring rain to provide food
 - i. God is the only God who can provide
 - ii. Only God is Sovereign over creation
 - B. False Gods Can Provide Nothing (2a)
 - 1. False Idols (the teraphim) only speak iniquity
 - i. They are man made idols
 - ii. They neither see nor hear
 - iii. The only thing they give is sin against the true God
 - 2. Diviners (those who see dreams)
 - C. False Religion Only Gives False Hope (2b)
 - 1. Those who promote false religion comfort in vain
 - 2. Lying visions and dreams give a false hope
 - 3. They speak of good things but they are wrong
 - i. A message of hope is only hope if its true
 - ii. If its not true, it's a horrible deception
- II. God Has Promised Deliverance to His People (2c-12)
 - A. God Will Deal With the False Shepherds (2c-3)
 - 1. The People Suffer Because they have no Shepherd (2c)
 - i. God's people wander like lost sheep
 - a. They are disobedient
 - b. They are ignorant of God's will
 - c. Ignorance is no excuse
 - ii. God's people suffer because of their disobedience
 - iii. There is no good shepherd for the people
 - a. A good shepherds cares for the sheep
 - b. A good shepherd protects the sheep
 - c. A good shepherd does not seek his own good
 - 2. God will Punish the False Shepherds (3a)
 - i. God's anger is kindled against them
 - a. God does not take false teachers lightly
 - b. God brings his wrath against those who lead his people in the wrong ways
 - ii. God will punish those who lead the people astray
 - a. He calls them "male-goats"
 - b. In a group of sheep, male goats are bullies
 - c. Male goats hurt the sheep for their own purposes
 - 3. God will Protect His Flock and Make them Powerful (3b)
 - i. The Lord of hosts (armies) is with his flock
 - a. Even though there are false shepherds, God has not abandoned His people

- b. He is still with them in their wanderings
- ii. The Lord will make them strong in Him
 - a. He will make them like His war horse
 - b. He will give them the ability to fight the battles
 - c. He will give them the victory
- B. God will Provide His People a Good Shepherd (4) (Jesus)
 - 1. God will send his people a foundation
 - i. From God's people will come a cornerstone
 - a. A cornerstone is the foundation of the building
 - b. A cornerstone is the model for the other stones
 - ii. From God's people will come a tent peg
 - a. A peg is what holds things up
 - b. A tent peg is what anchors the tent
 - 2. God will send his people a warrior
 - i. From God's people will come a bow of battle
 - ii. From them righteous godly rulers
- C. The Good Shepherd Will Prosper God's People (5-12)
 - 1. God will Give His People Victory (5)
 - i. They will be as mighty men
 - ii. They will tread down their enemies
 - iii. They will fight
 - a. They will make war on their enemies
 - b. For us, the world, flesh, devil
 - iv. The Lord will be with them
 - a. God will indwell them
 - b. The Holy Spirit will Live in us
 - v. The strong enemy will be defeated.
 - 2. God will Redeem His people (6a)
 - i. God will strengthen His people
 - a. The house of Judah
 - b. The house of Ioseph
 - c. Representative of the people of God coming back from captivity
 - ii. God will bring his people back in His compassion
 - a. This is not just to the land
 - b. At this time people were already returning to the land
 - c. Zechariah is speaking also about returning to God
 - iii. God will Justify His People
 - a. They will be as though I had not rejected them
 - b. "just as if they had never sinned"
 - 3. God will Answer His People's Call (6b)
 - i. God has not forgotten that He is their God
 - ii. Therefore He will answer when they call to Him
 - 4. God will Bring Joy to His People (7)
 - i. Ephraim (the 10 tribes of the north) will be like mighty men
 - ii. They will have the joy of the Lord as if they had wine

- a. Wine is a symbol of Joy in the OT
- b. Wine makes the heart glad
- iii. The new heart of the people will rejoice in the Lord
- 5. God will Grow His People (8)
 - i. God will call His people back to Himself
 - ii. God will redeem them (buy them back) (Jesus death?)
 - iii. They will be as numerous as before (sands of the seashore)
- 6. God will Bring His People Back From their Captivity (9-10)
 - i. The people will repent from their judgment (9)
 - a. God will scatter them but they will turn to him in their far country
 - b. God's people will return
 - ii. God will rescue them from their captivity (10)
 - a. He mentions Assyria and Egypt
 - b. The people are returning from Babylon
 - c. Therefore God is using the "far country" to symbolize the pagan nations as a whole that have captivated His people
 - d. He is calling His people back from their pagan practices and the judgment they have received.
- 7. God will Destroy His People's Enemies (11)
 - i. Although his people will go through distress they will win
 - a. They will pass through the sea of distress
 - b. but they will strike the Nile and dry it up
 - c. The pride of Assyria will be brought down
 - d. The scepter of Egypt will depart
 - ii. God will not allow the ungodly to continually reign over His people
- 8. God will Strengthen Them in His Authority (12)
 - i. "I will strengthen them in the Lord"
 - a. Notice God speaks of another
 - b. God will strengthen them in the Lord?
 - It seems God is speaking about strengthen them in another who is called Lord
 - This is the Father strengthen His people in the Son
 - ii. God says "in his name" they will walk who's name?
 - a. The Father says in Jesus name we will walk
